Dear Friends,

In my sermon on Celebration Sunday, I shared the secret but proven way to become the church we want to be, whether with greater attendance or more families, more educational opportunities, more outreach, or better stewardship. In case you missed church that day, here is the secret. Be That Church. Be the church we want to be. If we are waiting for more of anything to happen, please stop waiting and Be That Church. If we want to see full pews on Sunday morning, fill the pews. (Empty pews are a real turn-off to visitors.) If we want to be a church that attracts families, be here when our youth lead worship or our children offer the Christmas pageant, or we need someone to serve snacks at VBS, or we have a baby being baptized. Notice who is missing and let them know they are missed. Come to the outreach ministry team with your ideas for outreach projects you would like to help make happen. For all the progress we made in so many areas in 2022/2023, there is not one single ministry that does not need more involvement. Not one.

The good news is that we have everything we need to be the church God is calling us to be. God doesn't call us to be anything we are not equipped to be. All we have to do is Be That Church and Be That Church together.



Book Talk - *Whom Shall I Fear* by the Rev. Rosalind C Hughes Wednesday, July 12, 2023 from 6-7:30 pm in the Parish Hall

Churches are not immune to violence, as we have seen from shootings at houses of worship across the nation. The challenge for faith communities is how to respond to potential violence. *Whom Shall I Fear?* asks congregational leaders to examine whether their operational and security policies are consistent with gospel values. It raises common themes in approaches to church security and looks at

them in the light of scripture. *Whom Shall I Fear?* provides thought-provoking reflections on topics such as locked doors, living faithfully in an unfaithful world, the question of armed security in a church setting, and the duty of Christians to extend hospitality to their neighbor. The Calculator Countdown!



Volunteers needed for Habitat for Humanity July 15 and August 5

Help Build It

The picture you see below is the foundation of what will become a new safe, affordable home in Barberton for our partner family, Sabrina Weitensfelder and her three children. The first two summer workday opportunities for volunteers from Christ Church will be Saturday, July 15 and Saturday, August 5.

If you're thinking, "I'd like to help someone else out, but I'm not very handy", consider this: Habitat for Humanity has been helping unskilled (but thoughtful) volunteers (18 or older) to build homes for others for over 40 years. On a typical workday, an experienced supervisor instructs 8 volunteers on the tasks of that workday during the first hour and then observes their progress as they begin the work themselves. Inexperienced volunteers can pair up and work with those who are more experienced. By the end of the second hour, volunteers are chatting together as they share the task they've been assigned, be that putting down floor decking, raising walls, putting in new windows or doors, or hanging vinyl siding. Habitat will provide the tools needed for the day, but those who have tool belts are welcome to bring them. The workday is from 9 AM to 3:30 PM with lunch at noon and short breaks in the morning and afternoon. It's always a bit of a surprise to see how much has been accomplished by the end of the day. And it's fun to acquire a new skill along the way.

Volunteers from Christ Church and other churches in Hudson have joined together to help fund build a new home for and with a partner family in Summit County every year for the past 25 years. Getting to Know You

Each month we feature a little "getting to know" you vignette of a Christ Church parishioner or family in the Communicant. This month, Eileen Gaston helps us get to know a little bit more about the Dave and Pam McCallops. We look forward to getting to know you better, too!

Get to Know The McCallops

Dave and Pam McCallops have been attending Christ Church for more than 25 years. Many of us have seen their children grow up. But did you know the story of how they met? It sounds like a movie!

Dave has a lifelong arthritic condition, which led him to hip replacement at the tender age of 25. Back then, such surgery required six days of therapy, at Akron City Hospital. His physical therapist was a sweet and skilled young woman named Pam. As Dave says, "I hadn't showered or shaved in six days, but she was still laughing at my jokes, so I asked her out to lunch." Pam, we're glad you agreed!



Dave is a "cradle Episcopalian," having been baptized at St. John's, Cuyahoga Falls. Pam and her family moved a lot, with Milwaukee being her longest home base. They married in 1988 and moved to Hudson in 1995. Dave was the City Engineer, 1995-2006. He is now the director of water resources for Environmental Design Group, a private firm with many government clients. Pam continues as a part-time physical therapist, still at Akron City Hospital, now called Summa Health System.

Pam's Catholic family were faithful church-goers. But when expecting their first child, Pam wanted a united family. She agreed to become an Episcopalian if Dave would agree to attend regularly. Another good decision, Pam!

Remember those red-haired McCallops kids? Kelsey, age 33, grew up in Christ Church. Like her mom, she is a physical therapist, at Vanderbilt Medical Center, in Nashville. She is engaged to Aaron, who works for AT&T. Kathleen, now 31, has a PhD in Human Development and Family Sciences. She is a senior researcher at Christiana Care Health in Wilmington, DE. She's married to Jon, who is working on his PhD. David, 29, for whom we pray each Sunday, is Captain McCallops in the US Army, serving as the aide-decamp to a general in Poland. His wife Rachael is a nurse.



Dave played a very important role in the history of Christ Church. He was Senior Warden during a critical time of turmoil, all the while working as an engineer and having two more hip replacements. (No, he does not have three hips - he had to have them redone.) His term as Senior Warden was extended to two and a half years, because of having several interim rectors. Everyone in our parish is grateful for his steady leadership in a difficult time. He is now on the Standing Committee for the diocese and helped with the search for the new bishop. Their goal for the parish is that young families return to in-person worship. They agree that the Facebook Live option has both positives and negatives. We should "continue to support one another and try to get people to change their routines to get back in church."

Dave and Pam, thank you for your faithful commitment for decades.
