




# BUILDING FAITH FOMILY WORSHIP LEGO CHURCH & SUPPER Sunday, February 4 at 4:30 p.m.




#### WORDS AND WISDOM BOOK DISCUSSION

#### **Christ Church Legacy Circle**

This is the first of monthly articles from the Christ Church Legacy Circle Committee, and we hope you will find them helpful.

Did you know? IRA owners age 70½ or over may transfer up to \$100,000 to charity tax-free each year. These transfers are known as qualified charitable distributions or QCDs. And, for those who are at least 73 years old, QCDs count toward the IRA owner's required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year.

Normally, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable when received. With a QCD, however, these distributions become tax-free as long as they're paid directly from the IRA to an eligible charitable organization. QCDs must be made directly by the trustee of the IRA to the charity. An electronic payment or check made payable to the IRA owner is <u>not</u> a QCD. Contact your IRA trustee for further information.

The QCD option is available regardless of whether an eligible IRA owner itemizes deductions. Because donors receive Form 1099-R for QCDs, they must be reported appropriately on federal income tax returns, so it's important to discuss how to file with a tax professional.

For those eligible, please consider a QCD to fulfill your Christ Church annual pledge and/or to kick-start a gift to the Legacy Circle endowment.

#### **Getting to Know You**


Each month we feature a little "getting to know" you vignette of a Christ Church parishioner or family in the Communicant. This month, Eileen Gaston helps us get to know a little bit more about Len and Jane Harrison. #### Get to Know The Harrisons

Just look and listen at Christ Church any Sunday and you will be thankful for the work of Len and Jane Harrison. From the often used, hand-crafted candle stand to the creative floral offerings to the harmonies of bass and alto in the choir, we are surrounded. Len is a master woodworker, Jane is co-chair of the Flower Guild, and that's just the beginning.

But the real beginning was at Dog & Suds in Barberton! Jane was an 11th grade car hop. Len was a Bowling Green student, home for the summer. He asked to drive her home - two blocks. She agreed, but STRAIGHT HOME. He returned the next night. This time they drove around for a bit. Fast forward three years and many letters and phone calls. They married in 1971. He was a full-time student and also worked full-time at Firestone, in tire development. Jane worked as a secretary and went to college at night.

Len was trained in programming at Firestone and was promoted to IT management. Jane was able to attend The University of Akron, graduating with a degree in Clothing & Textiles. She started an interior design company - Decorating & Design by Jane. (Now we see what inspires those great floral arrangements!) Meanwhile, Len earned an MBA at Case Western.



In 1998, after Firestone and Bridgestone merged, Len was moved to the company's new headquarters in Nashville to consolidate IT in the Americas. There he also began volunteering weekly with Habitat for Humanity, becoming a volunteer site supervisor. Jane worked along side him and took up other volunteer work as well. In 2009, he opted for early retirement, returning to northeast Ohio to be with family. They built a beautiful home in Cuyahoga Falls, close to the National Park.

Their church story is a familiar one. He was raised Lutheran, she was Catholic. But they found a mutual home in the Episcopal faith at St. Paul's in Akron, then at St. Bartholomew's in Nashville. They sang in the choir and were active volunteers in outreach. At Christ Church, they quickly became involved...in choir, Flower Guild, Welcome Table (Jane), and Bible & Biscuits (Len), and EFM (both). Len was elected to Vestry (2012-2014) and served as Senior Warden during our time of Interim Ministers. He was a vital part of the Parish Hall renovation during the pandemic.

Len's woodworking skills enabled him to design and build choir desks and a cubbie storage system for the choir room.

Jane's creativity is demonstrated through flowers, through crocheting, and through gorgeous original hand-cut cards.

Their commitment to Christ Church is evident in all that they do. They love the close relationships they've developed in working with others. "Like family," Jane says. Len is pleased to see new families with "committed parents," who are making Christ Church their families' church. In the future, they hope to see Christ Church continue to grow as a community through the many gifts and contributions of those who choose to make Christ Church their own.

- The incoming vestry members introduced themselves with their name and one question they have about serving on vestry. The current vestry members introduced themselves with their name and one piece of advice for the incoming vestry.
- Thank you notes from the Revs. Allan Belton, Gretchen Green, and Daniel Grossoehme, and for their Christmas gifts from the parish.
- The vestry voted to increase the outreach line in the 2024 budget by 5% which is \$600.
- The vestry decided not to add an upper age limit to the proposed amendment to the Christ Church Bylaws to allow for a youth member of vestry.
- Charlotte announced that she will retire effective April 30, 2024. Much time was spent in discussion of that reality and the role of the vestry during the transition period.

- The vestry retreat will be Saturday, March 9 in the Parish Hall.
- The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, February 27 at 6pm.
