"The Great Emergence: How Christianity is Changing and Why"



- -Registration/Check in (1-2 people): Make sure payment and registration info is in and correct. Pass out name tags. Greet parents and children daily
- -Check out (1): greeting parents at the door at the end of each day and checking out their child(ren) with their teachers
- -Drama (2-3): perform little skits during opening and closing gatherings—can be teens
- -Service Learning (1): teach lessons and activities about the mission project for the week
- -Arts (1): lead easy arts and crafts that help to build connections with the day's theme
- -Science and Nature (1): lead easy science experiments and nature lessons
- -Shepherds (2 for each grade level 1st-6th Grade—12 total): lead group to each rotation station. Lead reflection time at the start of each day
- -PreK/K Leader (3-4): lead the PreK/K classes in all activities

Support roles:

- -Shopping: food for snacks, supplies for rotations, etc.
- -Administrative work: making copies, cutting out materials, prepping materials for rotations
- -Set up (3-4): Setting up chairs and rooms each morning (by 8:30)
- -Tear down (3-4): putting chairs and supplies away at the end of each day.
- -Prepping crafts: getting crafts supplies ready to go for each day

Cleveland Orchestra Members in Recital



Get to Know Dick and Amy Greenburg McCormick

On December 29, 1999, you were probably preparing for the Y2K turn of the millennium, wondering if the predicted tech glitches would occur. For Dick and Amy Greenberg McCormick, that was the day their life took a sudden turn. Their beautiful Victorian farmhouse on South Main Street in Hudson was destroyed in a fire started by a roofer doing work on the house. The good news was that the firemen took quick action to save most of the contents, including Amy's beloved 1929 grand piano by covering things with sturdy protective tarps!

Dick and Amy worked to reproduce the house in all its glory after having to demolish the original house. The home has wonderful built in wooden cabinets, tile work and wallpaper, much of it lovingly installed by Dick. And a "history room" in the basement tells the story of the original house and the fire.





Dick grew up a Roman Catholic in Cleveland and worked in construction, putting himself through night college, eventually earning a Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology. For 32 years, he worked at the Veterans Health Administration, keeping a clinical caseload while he directed drug treatment and mental health programs for all five VA hospitals in Ohio. He retired in 2002, but has continued his mission with military members and veterans, visiting military bases around the world to improve mental health resources, and conducting health services research.

Amy grew up in New York City, in a Jewish family that was not affiliated with a synagogue. She is a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor, and worked at the Kevin Coleman Center in Kent and then for Empathia, a national employee assistance company where she provided onsite clinical mental health services at jobsites.

Amy and Dick were married (at the 1876 house) in 1980. They adopted two infants from Colombia. The family celebrated both Christian and Jewish holidays. When Amy's mother died in 1998 Amy experienced sitting shiva with the loving support of her sister's congregation. This led to a desire to increase her ties to the Jewish community in Hudson by joining Temple Beth Shalom. There she has served on the Board, and currently is the Membership Chairperson. Dick was drawn to Christ Church after meeting Don Reed in a writing group and meeting Charlotte. Their first experience at church was a Nativity pageant!

Dick and Amy support each other in their interfaith marriage. Dick sings in the church choir, and Amy regularly attends services at Christ Church. Amy has taken an active part in the *Holy Envy* book discussion. Both are active participants in the communal aspects of both congregations.

Their goals for Christ Church: to expand the number of families. As Dick says, "It is a light under a basket. I want others to discover what I have found here." Both Amy and Dick are interested in increasing interfaith knowledge and understanding in the Hudson Community and appreciate the strong combined leadership of Charlotte, Rabbi Michael Ross and Rev. Peter Wiley (Congregational) in promoting interfaith endeavors.
