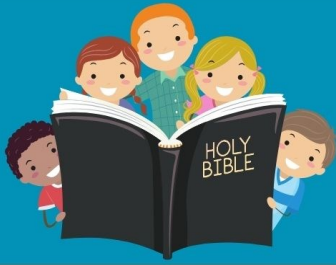

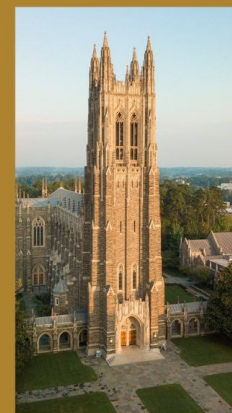

Notes From the Music Director

Last month, I attended the Choirmasters' Conference at Saint Thomas Church in NYC. During this yearly conference, choirmasters from around the world gather for a few days of continuing education. Saint Thomas is well known for having a highly respected men and boys choir. For 100 years, there has been a choir school for the boys affiliated with the church. These boys sing 6-8 services a week with each service having different music. On average, one boy will sing over 1000 pieces of music in the span of a school year.

At this conference, I got to see the choirs in action with Dr. Philip Moore, retired Choirmaster and Organist of York Minster, as the guest clinician. What I observed was a profound sense of purpose. The choir knew they had a great calling: to lead the people's song. They were there to sing for the Glory of God, not perform (although they do have concerts outside of regular service duties!). It was an affirmation for me that at Christ Church, we are doing the right stuff. We are leading the people's song, we are empowering young people to be leaders in the church, and we are inspiring awe in our repertoire. Children don't need things dumbed down. They are quite able to approach difficult tasks with professionalism if you teach them correctly. We have seen this at Christ Church. I tell the choristers all the time that they are the only children in Hudson (and the surrounding towns) that are singing this repertoire. That is something special. That is something to be cherished.

As we are at the end of the choir season, I want to give a HUGE thank you to all the people involved in the music program at Christ Church. It was a big year of music for us! The Adult Choir not only grew in numbers but has sung a lot of new repertoire, always leading us to a more profound worship. Thank you all in the Adult Choir for your continued dedication to the choir. The Young Choristers have also grown so much this season. They continue to inspire me. I tell both choirs how they will never know how impactful their singing is to the people in the pew. If you haven't, please take time to thank them for their ministry.

OUTREACH MINISTRY

Outreach is like a stool with three legs. The first leg is that outreach involves acts of service. The second leg is the fellowship and relationship-building within our community through participation. The third (and clearly most important) leg is that outreach brings glory to God. And this solid and beautiful stool is continuous, even through the summer months. Here at Christ Church we have a number of great summer outreach activities for participants of all ages, when you are home and perhaps slightly less structured.

***Open M** always needs Blessing Cards. These accompany meals that are distributed and are so simple. Just a folded index card or construction paper will do. A design and drawing on the front and a short note of encouragement (God Loves You, Joy, Peace) inside. People delight in cards made from our youngest to our oldest. There is a basket in the coat room where they can be left.

***A specific Open M activity - Grab and Go lunches** from Christ Church will be assembled on Friday, August. 23 at 9 am. Please contact Susan Mailey to let her know of your interest. Tmail153@gmail.com.

***PB&J Brigade** for the homeless at St. Bernard's Church in Akron, assembled in our parish hall - children accompanied by adults, and adults without children! Please note shifting dates: June 15, July 13, Sept. 14, all at 10 am. August is covered.

***Habitat for Humanity** - up to 7 volunteers needed each time, minimum age 18. No skills necessary, just a willingness to learn. As Len Harrison said, "Basically everyone can do it." June 29. July 20. October. 5. All day, in the North Hill section of Akron. If you really don't want to master a tool, a huge treat for the workers is a delivered lunch. ***The Akron Canton Food Bank** - 2.5 hour shifts are during the week, AM and PM, for volunteers from age 10 onward, children accompanied by an adult. Help people pick out groceries, sort food on arrival, prep boxes for seniors, repackage food delivered in bulk. Commitment is open from one time through a more regular basis.

***Of course** we continue to collect **laundry detergent** every month. Clothes need to be washed in all seasons.

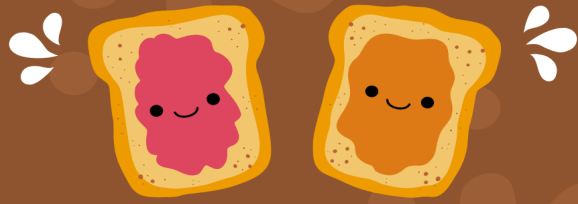

Getting to Know You

Each month we feature a little “getting to know” you vignette of a Christ Church parishioner or family in the Communicant. This month, Eileen Gaston helps us get to know a little bit more about Daniel Grosseohme. Get to Know Daniel Grosseohme

As we enter the post-Charlotte era, some of you may be wondering - What about Daniel Grosseohme? Why can't he just step in and take over as interim? He's a priest; he's an excellent preacher; he even comes to Adult Forum and coffee hour! All true, but there is much, much more to Daniel.

Did you know that his name is pronounced *grow-sum-me*? That he has had a long career as a pediatric chaplain in two children's hospitals? That he is employed FULL TIME as a Senior Research Scientist, in the Palliative Care Division of Akron Children's Hospital? That he has a wife who lives in Michigan?

Daniel grew up near Cincinnati. His educational journey is broad and diverse, from a BS in Astrophysics (Indiana U), to a Master's in Divinity (Virginia Theological Seminary), to a Doctorate in Pastoral Counseling, to a Master's in Clinical & Translational Research. Whew! As he says, “I kinda like being a student.”

He was raised in the United Methodist Church; in high school, the choir director asked him to join. “That was the point I began to go to church because I wanted to instead of having to.” (*Hear that, Mario?*) While in college he visited an Episcopal church on All Saints' Day and hasn't left. “The music and liturgy hooked me, and I realized that ‘worship’ was a verb for these people!”



While at seminary, he met his wife Henny, who is also a priest. She most recently served a parish in Detroit and has retired to their “forever home” in Troy, MI, near her sisters. Daniel visits her once a month and sometimes serves as a “supply priest.” (She visits him once a month too!) They have a 28-year-old son, Nate, who lives in Erlanger, KY, near Cincinnati. He is an aviation mechanic maintaining flight simulators for pilot safety training.

Daniel was a pediatric chaplain at Akron Children's Hospital from 1993-2003. Then he served as chaplain at Cincinnati Children's Hospital (2003-2018). He built a research career in chaplaincy research and the role of religion/spirituality in medical care.

In 2018, he returned to Akron for his present job as Senior Research Scientist at Akron Children's Hospital's Palliative Care Center. “Doing science that improves the quality of life for children and families is to me a very healing ‘priestly’ ministry. And it leaves me free on Sundays to be affiliated with a parish.” He had served at Christ Church from 2000 to 2003. When he returned, Charlotte's collegiality and the music “made it feel like coming back home.”

He and Henny enjoy long-distance hiking in Scotland. They enjoyed a 75 mile walk over a week in the Highlands in May. He also likes to play the viola in Symphony West Orchestra and, in his spare time, enjoys reading and cooking.

His goal for our parish? “For us to figure out who Christ Church wants to be for the next 3-5 years.”

May Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met on May 28 at 6:00pm.
- The vestry voted to list Christ Church on the Gay Church website. This website includes most of the Episcopal churches in our diocese. It is for churches which are considered open and affirming, a designation vestry voted to adopt several years ago. Vestry also plans to place a sign outside the church for Gay Pride month in June, using a new design of the Episcopal logo in rainbow colors with the inscription, "The Episcopal Church Welcomes You."
- The vestry reviewed its new greeting initiative and decided to continue it.
- The vestry voted to approve a budget of \$15,000 for the Search Committee.
- Theresa Edwards, the vestry liaison to the Search Committee, gave an update on the Search Committee's meeting on May 11 with Ann Schmidt, the Search Consultant, who led them through the entire process, giving special attention to the privacy concerns inherent in the process. The Search Committee will have a parish meeting on Sunday, June 23, at 11 am, to gather information to be used in preparing the parish profile.
- The vestry discussed and gave its support for a summer fundraiser by the Outreach Ministry to collect new and gently used blankets, along with monetary donations for the purchase of pots & pans for the International Institute of Akron.
- The vestry went into Executive Session at 7:45 pm.
- The next vestry meeting is June 23 at 6:00 p.m.



CALLING ALL VOLUNTEERS!

- Registration/Check in (1-2 people): Make sure payment and registration info is in and correct. Pass out name tags. Greet parents and children daily
- Check out (1): greeting parents at the door and checking out children at the end of each day
- Drama (2-3): perform little skits during opening and closing gatherings—can be teens
- Service Learning (1): teach lessons and activities about the mission project for the week
- Arts (1): lead easy arts and crafts that help to build connections with the day's theme
- Science and Nature (1): lead easy science experiments and nature lessons
- Shepherds (2 for each grade level 1st-6th Grade; 12 total): lead group to each rotation station. Lead reflection time at the start of each day
- PreK/K Leader (3-4): lead the PreK/K classes in all activities

Support roles:

- Shopping: food for snacks, supplies for rotations, etc.
- Administrative work: making copies, cutting out materials, prepping materials for rotations
- Set up (3-4): Setting up chairs and rooms each morning (by 8:30)
- Tear down (3-4): putting chairs and supplies away at the end of each day.
- Prepping crafts: getting crafts supplies ready to go for each day
