Luke graduated from Hudson High School. He plans to attend Oklahoma State University majoring in aerospace administration and training to become a professional pilot.




Ben Bixby

"Vector of the Rector" - Pointing somewhere vaguely spiritual

And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant... Love never ends. – 1 Corinthians 13:2-4, 8

A seminary classmate of mine recently made the *Mini-Vows* section of the *New York Times*. The head-line? "An Operatic Tenor and an Episcopal Priest Hit the Right Notes." Their wedding was officiated by a bishop, attended by 800 guests, and described by more than one parishioner as "the closest thing I've ever seen to a royal wedding."

I mean, I'm thrilled for them. Really. It's just that while they were sharing rooftop rosé at a black-tie reception catered with fried chicken and waffles, my wife and I were sharing a rhinovirus and building Ikea furniture.

But it did remind me that wedding season is here—and with it, the return of 1 Corinthians 13.

Now, this passage gets trotted out for just about every wedding, but verses 2–4? They're not particularly romantic. They're more of a gut-check: a reminder that our best performances—our speaking in tongues, our sacrificial giving, our spiritual résumés—amount to noise without love.

And let's face it, there's a lot of performance in modern life. We curate careers, quote headlines, humblebrag our parenting wins, and stake out our corner of political virtue. And underneath it all is often a pretty simple hope: That someone will notice. That someone will love us.

But the love Paul describes isn't applause-worthy. It isn't about optics. It's patient. It's kind. It doesn't show off or keep score. It endures even when your Twitter takes age poorly and your carefully built image starts to crack.

This is the love of God. Not the sentimental variety, but the stubborn, unrelenting kind that sticks with you when the romance cools, the job title disappears, and the livestream buffers. It's the love that laid itself down without any of the frills—just a cross—and said, "You are mine. Still."

It's not the kind of love that always makes the papers. But it is the kind that never fails.


Summer Worship Information

Children's Chapel

For children 3-years old through 2nd grade SUNDAY MORNINGS DURING THE 10:30 SERVICE.

Our program year is over and we are in our summer rhythm with weekly Children's Chapel. We are continuing with the Godly Play curriculum, which uses Montessori-based learning experiences to help children explore their faith through story, to gain religious language and to enhance their spiritual experience through wonder and play. Children have an innate sense of the presence of God and this program embraces and encourages that sense. We will be encountering some of the big characters of the Old Testament as well as the parables of Jesus. Children ages 3-2nd Grade (completed) will begin each Sunday in the service with their parents. During the Hymn of Praise, they will join Sarah Bhatia or a volunteer at the front of the sanctuary and return to their families during The Peace. This program offers a great opportunity for your children to grow in their understanding of faith and experience God in new ways. Come join us!


weather a wavy storm, and even imagine a new heaven and a new earth




Happy 100th Birthday to Bev Grant!

 The sanctuary could be without A/C for the summer.
- It was decided that the previously approved carpet installation will move forward, but the more extensive repairs to the sanctuary ceiling and floor will not.
- The leaking chimney in the Hand Room will be repaired rather than removed. Other future projects may include lighting upgrades and parking lot resurfacing.
- Training for the use of our AED unit will be held Tuesday, June 17 at 6:00 p.m. in the parish hall. The training is free and open to all.
- The vestry approved the purchase of an online church directory application. Photos can be added, and members will be able to update their own information securely.
- The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, June 24 at 6:00 p.m.

Pentecost Sunday: Wear Your Spirit Colors!

Sunday, June 8th is the Feast of Pentecost—also known as Whitsunday—and marks the grand finale of the Easter season. It's the day we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit and the "birthday" of the Church.

Traditionally, folks wear red (symbolizing the Holy Spirit's fire) or white (a nod to the English Whitsunday custom). Whether it's a red dress, a white shirt, or just a flash of festive color—like striped socks or a bold bow tie we invite you to join the celebration in style. Tip your hat to the Spirit and come ready to say, "Happy Birthday, Church!"
